Meyersdale Area Schools Recycling

To maintain functionality of the recycling shed and keep it open to the public, please adhere to the following rules:

We will only be accepting **sorted** (no mixed bags) recyclables that include:

- Plastics #1 and #2
- Glass
- Aluminum cans
- Tin cans
- Cardboard
- Paper (office paper, newspaper, magazines)

The following items are NOT accepted:

Containers from alcoholic products, plastic bags, paper towels, toilet paper, napkins, cardboard that contained food (e.g., pizza boxes, milk cartons), plastic containers with food waste, aluminum foil
Please note: The shed is part of a class project aimed at helping clean up our community. If the rules are violated, the shed will remain locked, and drop-offs will be by appointment only.

FFFF Recycling

Giant Eagle lot, North Center Avenue

Friday, March 1, 4-5PM

BIG Change is in the air for this Friday's FFFF recycling event! The event will be moved to the Right side of the North Center Ave Giant Eagle store. When facing the front of the store, the event will be a drive through event on the right side of the building, conducted much like the Electronic Collection events. You will drive up to the volunteers, open your trunk/hatch, or tell the volunteer where your recyclables are located in your vehicle. They will remove & scan items.

If all is correctly sorted & clean the volunteer will then deposit items in correct bins and send you on around the back of the building where you will drive the perimeter and come out on the other side of Harbor Freight. If the volunteers feel the items are not sorted or acceptable, they will inform you to either go to a parking spot and sort your items, or if items are not properly cleaned, they will kindly ask you to take them back home and clean them for a future contribution.

The goal is to increase safety, speed and accuracy of sorting, all while keeping you in your vehicle. Please be patient with the volunteers as they try to improve the experience and safety for all involved! We aim to assist in recycling efforts, not to act as a garbage removal service. Please clean and sort your items so the process can run smoothly. As a reminder sort

- #1 plastics in their own bag,
- #2 plastic in their own bag,
- #3,4,5,6 & 7 plastics can be mixed together in one bag;
- Office paper and junk mail in one bag
- magazines in one bag
- and newspapers in one bag.
- For metal donations please put aluminum in one bag, tin in a separate bag and
- "cat food cans" in their own bag.
- Corrugated cardboard and paperboard can be mixed together.

These steps will greatly help the volunteers process recyclables quickly and safely. THANK YOU for recycling and helping improve the process.
